Thursday, Oct 19, 2023 4:30 P.M.

#### 1. Call to Order at 4:35

- **2. Welcome and Introduction** Present: Meg McCarthy, Joe Jaszewski, Carl Whaley, Wava Kaufman, Chris Laraway, Charlie Hill, Stephen Lewis, Alexa Roitmann, Michael Keith, Dave Rader. Absent: Cynthia Gibson, Abigail Jenkins
- a. Approval of Minutes from the 8/17/23 and 9/21 /23 Meeting. Motion made by Charlie to approve minutes from 8/17/23, seconded by Carl, unanimous approval. Motion made by Carl to approve minutes from 9/21/23, seconded by Chris, unanimous approval.

#### 3. Discussion Items

- a. Elections and Leadership Positions Joe Jaszewski explained the leadership positions (secretary, vice chairman & chairman) is something we vote for on a yearly basis.... currently Cynthia Gibson is secretary, Michael Keith is vice chairman and Joe Jaszewski is chairman. Joe asked if there was anyone interested in being secretary, no one responded. Joe then nominated Cynthia Gibson for secretary for the 2024 year, seconded by Wava, unanimous approval. Joe asked if anyone was interested in being vice chairman, no one responded. Joe nominated Michael Keith for vice chairman for the 2024 year, seconded by Chris, unanimous approval. Joe asked if anyone was interested in being chairman, no one responded. Stephen nominated Joe Jaszewski for chairman for the 2024, seconded by Carl, unanimous approval.
- b. McKinley/Franklin/Jefferson Walk Debrief This discussion item has been tabled until next month (Nov)
- c. Linder Debrief and Next Steps (Michael Keith) It was appreciated that members of the PAG joined for the walk. In this corridor there is a park, school, high school and houses that face a road that may become a major arterial and there is a ditch that runs through the area that creates a challenge. It would be expensive to widen the road. The group talked about the accidents that have happened at the high school, which mainly have involved the teachers. Roundabouts were brought up, different treatments for pedestrian facility were discussed. The big question is do you take out the homes to widen the road or do we make it a more pedestrian type friendly corridor and focus on the neighborhood and school. Michael asked Carl and Stephen to share their views. Carl feels like its more of a kid's corridor, stem school, Linder Elem & high school another middle school and high school further north that can come down and use the skate park. Widening would invite more traffic and faster traffic which he feels would not make anyone in this area happy. Stephen explained that Linder is trying to serve a purpose of major arterial while trying to serve as a neighborhood street and it's hard for these two to coexist together well. Linder wants to be a major arterial street, but you have schools, driveways every 50 feet so this makes it hard for it to be a major arterial and a neighborhood street. Chris explained it is a kid, bike, and a car connection with the overpass being built. Changes have to be drastic

but not sure how this will work. Joe commented that when he walked it, it didn't feel like a pedestrian connection and it needs some enhancements especially with all the schools. It is our committees' job to make recommendations for the people on foot to keep them safe, even if that impinges on people driving. Chris commented that this is a huge project and how do we help with this. Michael asked Meg if we could draft a letter to the commission. Meg stated the project is very complicated, Brooke is meeting with property owners before the public meetings. Looks like the first of Dec will be the public meetings so we have a while to draft a letter. Michael asked if it is better to ask now in regards to specific things that keep pedestrians safe for the public to see what we are thinking or would we have more impact if we wait until we know what ACHD thinking, then say.... great ideas but safety can be improved by doing this. Where can we make the most impact? Meg responded with the walk and responding back was a great start. Impact wise being able to respond to concepts is more helpful because the currently concept has been developed. Meg advised us to give input when we see the concepts. Michael agreed that we have given input so now let's look at the concepts and make comments then. Joe agreed and asked if anyone had additional comments. No one had any comments and it was agreed that we will wait to draft a letter or comment until we see the concepts. Meg will update us when those concepts are live.

#### 4. Action Items

a Vacancy – Joe stated there are some really good candidates and the perspectives they could bring us. Joe opened it up for discussion on the candidates. Joe started off he felt 5 stood out due to experience and location. He shared his top 5 and thoughts as to why he chose them. Stephen shared his thoughts about his choices, Carl shared his thoughts about how one of the candidates brings a European perspective. Chris shared his thoughts about the candidates and how what they could bring to the group. No one else had anything to add. Joe requested that we send our 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice to Meg in the chat of our zoom meeting. After first vote there was a 3-way tie between Travis, Jerry and Diane. Joe suggested we all pick one and vote again. After voting a second time, Meg informed us we have a tie between Travis and Diane. Only one person voted for Jerry, that person has now voted for Travis. Travis is our winner and Diane will be our alternate. The second choice Meg will keep incase the person who we voted for can't do it or we need someone in the next couple of months.

5. **Open Public Comment** – Michael asked if anyone had attended the Walk Bike Alliance Conference. Alexa went and said it was really great and one of the most informative pieces is going to be the updated MUTCD and the PROWAG. These were really helpful most relevant to the PAG group. Alexa asked Dave if he could reach out to Chris in Coeur D' Alene to get the slides. Dave will also share a slide show from a webinar put on by the access board. Michael asked about the optional walk on Monday. We will meet at the corner of Mitchell and Victory at 5:30. We will walk some of it and shuttle some of it.

Next PAG meeting is scheduled for Nov 16 at 4:30PM via Zoom.
